She was a committee member of the Harrow Local Education Authority Early Years and Child Development Partnership (an organization like the State Universal Education Board in Nigeria) where she had responsibility for school safety, staff recruitment, funding and benchmarking for all schools in the London Borough of Harrow.

Ade is Chief Executive, London Borough of Bromley and joined Bromley Council in December 2016 as the Deputy Chief Executive from the City of London Corporation where, as Director for Community and Children's Services, he led the transformation of public services and improved outcomes for residents. He was responsible for improving children's services with a particular emphasis on safeguarding, so much so that the City and Hackney Safeguarding Board was awarded Ofsted's first 'outstanding' grading. Ade spent seven years as the director of social care at Lambeth Council and

during this time achieved outstanding by Ofsted in safeguarding and services for children in care, fostering and adoption. He was awarded an OBE in 2013.

In November 2018 Bromley achieved a 'good' in all areas of the inspection on Children's Social Care Services, with an 'outstanding' in leadership – a turnaround from an 'inadequate' rating in February 2016.

Ade is a Trustee of Coram, the UK's first ever charity dedicated to supporting the adoption of children. He is also a Freeman of the City of London, a unique historical title that dates back to 1237, as well as being a Freeman of the Haberdashers' Company, an ancient merchant guild.





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NSF (UK) EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT (NEED)


